Essential Skills Work Visa Application Form

Essential Skills work visa requirements

To be eligible for an Essential Skills work visa you must demonstrate that the requirements for applicants, employers, job offers, and the labour market test are met.

Applicants are required to:

- have a job offer for which they are suitably qualified and experienced
- · meet health and character requirements

Your job offer must be for employment that is:

- genuine and sustainable
- full time (at least 30 hours per week)
- paid by wages or salary
- not paid less than the market rate for New Zealand workers in that occupation
- not self-employment
- not related to planting, maintaining, harvesting or packing crops in the horticulture or viticulture industries.

Employers are required to:

- be your direct employer
- have previously complied with all relevant New Zealand employment and immigration law, and immigration instructions
- have previously paid any employees who held an Essential Skills work visa the remuneration required by those workers' work visa conditions.

If your role is for employment paid below the median wage, your employer must have engaged with Work and Income and received a Skills Match Report before offering you employment, unless:

- · you are remaining in your current and full-time employment and you hold one of the following visas:
 - a work visa of any type (including a Working Holiday visa), or
 - a student visa with conditions allowing unlimited work rights, or
 - a Critical Purpose visitor visa either granted as a critical health worker, or granted for more than six months as an 'other critical worker'

- the employer holds valid approval in principle for the role identified, or
- the role is included in a list of occupations published by Work and Income that are exempt from the Skills Match Report process, and meets any additional requirements of that list.

Labour market test

We must be satisfied there are no New Zealand workers suitable or trainable for the job you have been offered.

We will consider no New Zealanders are available or trainable if the job offered is:

- on the Regional Skill Shortage List, the Long Term Skill Shortage List, or the Construction and Infrastructure Skill Shortage List, and you meet the requirements listed on the skill shortage list, or
- with an employer who has a current approval in principle from us for your recruitment. If the above criteria do not apply, your employer must provide evidence of having made genuine attempts to recruit or train New Zealanders, such as undertaking advertising or engaging a recruitment company.

We do not need to be satisfied there are no New Zealanders available if:

- you already hold a temporary work visa, and have a valid Skilled Migrant Category (SMC) invitation to apply or an SMC application currently under assessment, or
- you are remaining in your current and full-time employment and you hold one of the following visas:
 - a work visa of any type (including a Working Holiday
 - a student visa with conditions allowing unlimited work rights, or
 - a Critical Purpose visitor visa either granted as a critical health worker, or granted for more than six months as an 'other critical worker'.



Remuneration and visa duration

The visa duration for Essential Skills visas is determined by the remuneration level. Visas may be granted for up to 3 years for employment, which is being paid at or above the median wage, and for up to 2 years for employment paid below the median wage.

If you are to be paid a salary and the number of hours worked each week can change, we may ask for evidence of the range of hours that will be worked. We will calculate the remuneration based on the maximum number of hours to be worked.

Supporting family members

Your family members may be eligible for the following visas based on their relationship to you.

Immigration Advisers Licensing Act 2007

Deciding whether you are eligible for a visa

Immigration New Zealand collects the information about you on this form to decide whether you are eligible for a work visa. We may also use the information to contact you for research purposes or to advise you on immigration matters.

Collecting the information is authorised by the Immigration Act 2009 and the Immigration Regulations made under that Act. You do not have to provide the information, but if you do not we are likely to decline your application.

Deciding whether you are eligible to board a flight to New Zealand

The information we collect may also be used to determine whether you are allowed to board a flight to New Zealand. We will not share your personal information with airline check-in agents; however, we will send a boarding message to the airline check-in agent based on the information you have provided in this form.

Immigration New Zealand may also share the information you have provided with other government agencies that are entitled to it by law, or with other agencies (as you have agreed in the declaration). You are able to ask for the information we hold about you and have any of it corrected if you think it is necessary. Sometimes we may ask for additional documents or information so that we can consider it with this application.
