Section 2. Citizenship Status

Federal law makes it unlawful for aliens who are illegally or unlawfully in the United States to receive or possess firearms. In addition, subject to certain exceptions, aliens who have a non-immigrant status are prohibited from possessing or receiving firearms in the United States.

However, a non-immigrant alien who is legally in the United States is not subject to this prohibition if the alien:

- (1) is in possession of a valid hunting license or permit lawfully issued in the United States;
- (2) is an official representative of a foreign government who is accredited to the United States or his or her government's mission to an international organization having its headquarters in the United States; or
- (3) has received a waiver from the prohibition from the Attorney General of the United States. See 18 U.S.C. 992(y)(2) for additional exceptions.

In order to determine whether applicants who are not U.S. citizens are prohibited from possessing firearms under Federal law, it is necessary to obtain answers to the following questions:

- 3) What is your country of citizenship? List more than one if applicable.

- 4) What is your INS-issued alien number or admission number? _____

If the answer to Question #6 is "NO," there is no need to continue. Please attach this form to your application and return all requested material to your Gun Permit location.

If the answer to Question #6 is "YES", please answer the follow-up questions below:

- 6a) Do you fall within any of the exemptions to the non-immigrant alien prohibition set forth in 18 U.S.C. 922(y)? YES NO
- 6b) If you answered "YES" to question 6a, under which exemption do you fall?

Please attach copies of your documentation that support your entitlement to the claimed exemption, where applicable.
