



If you intend to seek deferred prosecution from the court for an alcohol/drug related offense, you may use this form to request that the Department of Licensing (DOL) postpone suspension or revocation of your driver license.

This postponement (or stay) is no longer than 150 days after the charges are filed in court, or two years after the date of the arrest, whichever is shorter. The stay does not apply to a commercial driver license.

To qualify, you must:

- Have taken a breath/blood test at the time of your arrest.
- Not have previously entered into any alcohol/drug deferred prosecution program.
