Things you should know

This form is to apply for replacement or duplicate of the **same type** of license plates you currently have.

To change license plates to a **different type**, other applications and fees may apply. See <http://wisconsindot.gov/Pages/dmv/vehicles/frms-pubs/veh-forms.aspx> for applications and fees.

Non-personalized license plates

- » A new set of license plates will be issued and a new number will be assigned
- » Fees
 - » \$4 for single-plate vehicles (e.g. motorcycle/moped, trailer, and tractor*)
 - » \$8 for standard dual-plate vehicles (automobile/passenger, truck*, bus*, and motorhome)
 - » \$10 for special group plates (e.g. Packers, Military, EMS)
 - » \$12 for University of WI group and Celebrate Children plates
- » Expect delivery within 1-2 weeks
- » Upon receipt of the new plates, destroy the old plate(s). If plates are stolen, notify your local law enforcement of the stolen plate number.
 - *IRP/AppORTioned plates – use form [MV2914](#). WisCRS users process online

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and Firefighter license plates

- » If you currently have the white design and would like to change to the new red and white design, send \$40 and complete the vehicle information on the *Civilian License Plates Application* form, [MV2652](#).

Personalized license plates

- » Choose if 1 or 2 plates need to be duplicated
- » Fees
 - » \$4 for single plate vehicles (e.g. motorcycle)
 - » \$4 each for standard plates
 - » \$5 each for special group plates (e.g. Packers, Military, EMS)
 - » \$6 each for University of WI and Celebrate Children plates
- » Expect delivery within 4-6 weeks
- » Stolen personalized plates
 - If your personalized plates were stolen, notify your local law enforcement agency. WisDOT recommends choosing a new plate message when using form [MV2428](#). If you choose to keep the same personalized plate message, additional documentation confirming you as rightful owner of the plates will be sent to you. This documentation can be presented to law enforcement in any state should you be pulled over for possession of stolen plates.

Special Interest license plates

- (e.g. Collector, Collector Special, Hobbyist, Collector/Hobbyist Cycle, Amateur Radio)
- » Choose if 1 or 2 plates need to be duplicated
 - » Duplication fee of \$4 each plate
 - » Expect delivery within 4-6 weeks

- \$4.00** - Replace my non-personalized motorcycle/moped, trailer, or tractor* plate
 - \$8.00** - Replace my non-personalized standard automobile/passenger, truck*, bus*, or motorhome license plates
 - \$12.00** - Replace my non-personalized University of WI group **or** Celebrate Children license plates
 - \$10.00** - Replace my non-personalized special group license plates (e.g. Packers, Military, EMS)
